

ACTIVITY 3A

HANGMAN

The teacher thinks of a word or phrase about insects and draws a number of dashes equivalent to the number of letters in the word or phrase; the students try to guess what it is saying one letter at a time. If one of the students suggests a letter that occurs in the word, the teacher fills in the blanks with that letter in the right places. If the word does not contain the suggested letter, the teacher draws one element of a hangman's gallows. As the game progresses, a segment of the gallows and of a victim is added for every suggested letter which is wrong as it is not in the word/phrase. Students win if they guess the word or phrase but lose the game if the elements of a hangman's gallows are completed. The first player to guess the correct answer thinks of the word for the next round.

Objective

Guess the word/phrase before your man gets hung!



Example of words:

CATERPILLAR – SPIDERS – INSECTS – BEETLE

Example of phrases: INSECTS HAVE SIX LEGS - SOME INSECTS CAN FLY - INSECTS
HAVE THREE BODY PARTS
